KSB plant workshop is April 1

Keep Sedona Beautiful, Inc. will host its annual Native Plant Workshop on Saturday, April 1, 8:45 a.m. to 2 p.m., at KSB headquarters in the historic Pushmataha Building, 360 Brewer Road. Space is limited and reservations are required.

The workshop is scheduled as the kick-off event for "April is Water Awareness Month" promoted by the Sedona Water Wise Alliance and the city of

Sedona. Bashas' is the principal sponsor of the workshop.

Themed "Landscaping in the High Desert," expert speakers will include Jeff Schalau, of the University of Arizona Cooperative Extension on "Managing Seeds, Soils, Flowers and Native Plants in a Drought;" Lainie Kligman, manager of Native Plant and Seed in Flagstaff, on "Natives Grasses for Sedona's Elevation" Roger Eastman,

senior planner for the city of Sedona, on "Sedona's New Native Tree Preservation, Protection and Planting Ordinance;" John Neville, president of Sustainable Arizona, on "Infrastructure and Water Harvesting: How to Keep the Water on Your Lot;" and Barnabus Kane, landscape architect, on "Gorgeous Landscape Design Makes the Difference."

"We have a fabulous lineup

of speakers" stated Doug Blackwell, a KSB member who is chairing the event. He added, "With the current drought conditions, this is very timely."
