## Rezoning Hearing Postponed

The request for consideration of a zoning map change for the property located on the southeastern corner of State Route 179 and Jacks Canyon Road in the Village of Oak Creek, has been postponed.

Originally scheduled for Wednesday August 21, the matter will instead be heard during a regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors on Wednesday November 20. This meeting will be held at 10 S 6th Street in Cottonwood, and will start at 9:00 am.

This request is to change zoning for the property from RCU-2A (Residential Rural) to C2-1 (Commercial), so that a Hilton Garden Inn can be built on the parcel, at the entrance to the Village of Oak Creek.

# Climate Change: What's Gender Got to Do with It? *How Women will lead us to a More Sustainable Future*

Northern AZ Climate Change Alliance (NAZCCA) and Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) will feature a presentation and discussion by Dr. Frances Julia Riemer that explores the many issues of social justice and inequity in a changing climate.

We will examine the higher risks and greater burdens on women from the impacts of climate change, and discuss the ways in which unequal participation in decision-making processes and labor markets compound these effects and prevent women from fully contributing to climate-related planning, policy-making, and implementation.

We will also discuss the critical roles played by women in response to climate change. Across the globe, women's knowledge of sustainable practices at the household and community levels and women's participation at the political level has resulted in a greater focus and responsiveness to community needs and climate-related programs and policies.

Dr. Frances Julia Riemer is Professor of Educational Foundations and Associate Faculty, former Director of Women's and Gender Studies Program at Northern Arizona University. An educational anthropologist who has conducted ethnographic research in the US, Africa, and Latin America; she focuses on change and issues of equity and access, gender, development and sustainable communities, as well as cultural differences and social organizations of community, school, and workplace. Dr. Riemer also serves on NAZCCA Board of Directors.

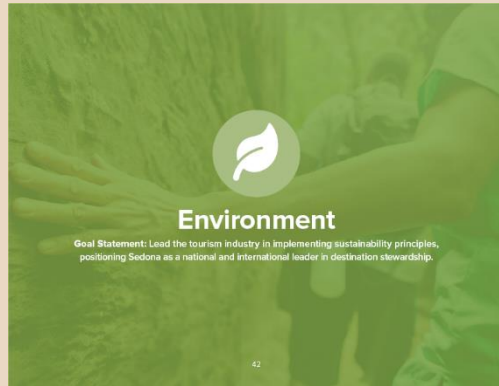

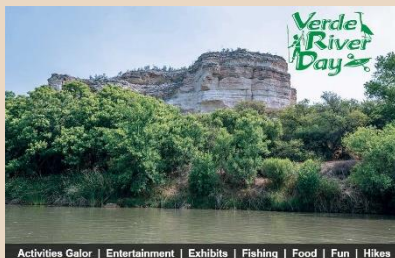


## Volunteers Needed for Sustainable Tourism Plan Objectives

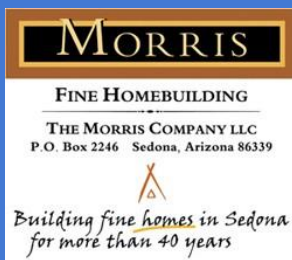
